Key Vocabulary

Collage - art in which bits and pieces of paper and fabric have been pasted onto a 2-dimensional surface.

Cut out - the shape of a person, object etc that has been cut out.

Glue - (noun) a sticky substance that you use to stick things together. (verb) to join things together using glue.

Layer- an amount of something that covers the surface.

Background - the part of a picture that is behind the main things or people.

Tissue - a piece of thin paper.

Tear - To rip pieces of material.

- Collage describes both the technique and the resulting work of art in which pieces of paper, photographs, fabric, and other materials are arranged and stuck down onto a surface
- Collage can include other media such as painting and drawing, as well as contain three-dimensional elements
- Collages can be made with natural materials, where the artist overlaps and layers to create the desired effect.
