Class 1 'Shining Stars'

Class 1 have continued to work hard this week whilst trying to stay cool in the extremely hot weather! We have all had lots of hydration breaks and plenty of icy treats too!

After learning about France last week, this week we have been learning about Italy. Class 1 learnt some Italian words, used maps to locate the country and discussed what food and drinks they have there. After learning that one of their traditional foods is pizza, the children all wrote lists of what toppings they would have, designed a pizza and then had a go at making their own on Friday morning!

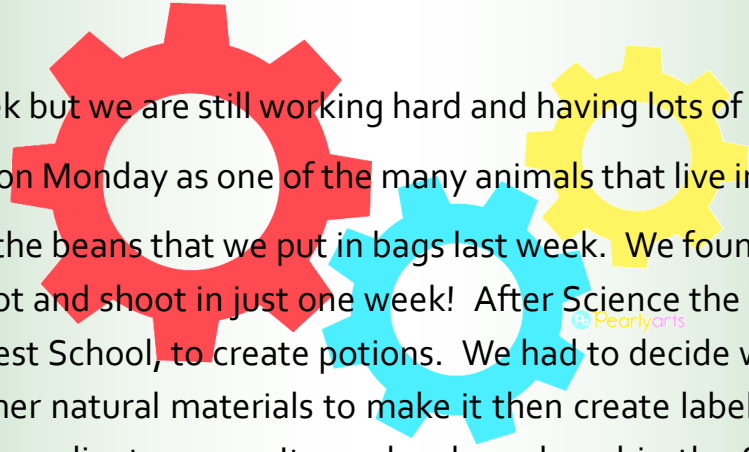
Year 1 have shown determination and independence by completing some end of year assessments this week. We are extremely proud of the progress they have all made and how hard they continue to work.

In Maths, we have been focusing on capacity and volume. The children have learnt what both words mean, and then using their knowledge within play to explore the terms further.

Another busy and hot week but we are still working hard and having lots of fun.

We learnt all about sloths on Monday as one of the many animals that live in the rainforest.

On Tuesday we observed the beans that we put in bags last week. We found that most of them have split open and grown a root and shoot in just one week! After Science the Years 1, 2 and 3 went into the Secret Garden for Forest School, to create potions. We had to decide what kind of magic potion we wanted to create, gather natural materials to make it then create labels to tell everyone what it would do and what the ingredients were. It was lovely and cool in the Secret Garden and we all created fantastic potions.



We finished our book – 'Dolphin Boy' in English and we are moving on to a book called 'Flotsam' next week to continue our seaside theme.

The end of the week was filled with dance, scooting, boxercise and football – with lots of rest and water breaks!

Well done Class 3 on a fantastic week of learning and effort during the recent hot weather. The children have shown excellent resilience, a positive attitude, and great teamwork throughout the week, and it has been a pleasure to see how well they have adapted to the conditions.



In maths, they have worked very hard, continuing to focus on money and decimals. Year 4 and 5 have been converting money, adding and subtracting money and decimals, whilst Year 6 have been thinking about value for money. They have shown growing confidence when tackling new tasks and have been making good progress.

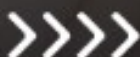

14th May

After his Resurrection, Jesus appeared to his disciples over a period of forty days.

This is the day we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION
SUMMER TERM 2026
TO KNOW YOU MORE CLEARLY

Dear Parent(s)/Carer(s),

Our classes will be studying the new Religious Education Directory curriculum that covers the themes of 'To the Ends of the Earth' and 'Dialogue and Encounter'.

'TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH'
(13th April – 22nd May)

Class 1 – The children will retell the story of Pentecost – a special celebration in the Church.

Class 2 - The children will sequence the events from Jesus' Resurrection to the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. They will also retell the story of the Conversion of Saul and learn about how the fruits of the Holy Spirit can transform their lives.

Class 3 – The children will study the Resurrection told in St John's gospel and make links with Matthew's account of Peter's declaration of faith. By looking at the Apostles Creed, they will explore their beliefs as Christians. Throughout May they will reflect on Mary being the Mother of the Church.

**SUGGESTIONS FOR
HOME ACTIVITIES**

Talk about good news in your family and how you shared it.

Ask your child to tell you the story of Pentecost and the work of the Holy Spirit.

'DIALOGUE & ENCOUNTER'
(8th June – 22nd July)

Class 1– The children will learn about the lives of St Peter and St Paul, and how they were friends of Jesus. They will then explore the music, food, smells, tastes and clothing from the Jewish faith.

Class 2– The children will start by studying the story of the Good Samaritan, thinking about Jesus' question 'Who is my neighbour?' They will then learn about the traditions of the Jewish laws, beliefs, worship and life.

Class 3– The children will begin the branch by looking at the life and work of St Paul. Later in the theme, they will learn about the five pillars of Islam and understand how Muslims in Britain today live out their beliefs.

**SUGGESTIONS FOR
HOME ACTIVITIES**

Look at a globe or an atlas. Find a special place and pray for the people of that country.

Discuss how we can look after our world and support our neighbours, near and far.

School Parking

Have you considered:

- Walking or cycling to school instead? This is a great way to contribute to a child's 60 minutes of activity a day and is easy to incorporate into your daily routine. Try it once a week at first and see how easy it can be.
- Parking nearby or getting off the bus two stops earlier and walking the rest of the way. If you live too far away to walk or need your car for your commute to work you can still walk part of the way. Adults in England should aim to take part in at least 150 minutes of moderate intensity physical activity each week.
- Car sharing is a great way to reduce congestion and save you pennies. Team up with other parents or carers who live nearby- share the cost and halve the hassle.

A Guide to Parking Safely at Our Schools

Inconsiderate and dangerous parking around our schools has become a big problem, putting the safety of children and others at risk. We all want to keep our children safe around schools, so here are some top tips on how you can make a difference.

How can you help?

- ✓ Keep your speed down
- ✓ Turn your engine off - do not idle
- ✓ Leave the middle of the road free, with enough room for other road users to easily pass through
- ✓ Make sure your child leaves and enters your vehicle safely onto the pavement
- ✓ Check for pedestrians and cyclists before opening a car door
- ✓ Leave enough room on pavements for pedestrians, pushchairs & wheelchairs to get past
- ✓ Take care when reversing
- ✓ DO NOT PARK ON ZIG ZAG LINES

Please keep restricted areas clear

- ✓ Zig zags and school entrances
- ✓ Dropped kerbs
- ✓ Resident's driveways
- ✓ Opposite or within 10 metres of a junction- so that children can see cars and cars can see children.

Your questions answered

What would happen if I did park in a restricted area?

If you park in a restricted area you are putting children's lives in danger and for this reason school parking is regularly monitored and enforced. If you park in a restricted area you could receive a £70 fine.

Am I okay to stop on zig zag markings if I am only there a few minutes?

No, under no circumstances should you stop on zig zag markings at any time, these are there to protect school entrances and leave a clear view of the street for pedestrians.

Please park considerably around our schools and keep our children safe!

Don't forget...

Congestion around schools is one of the main reasons given for dangerous parking and there are other ways you could do the school run...



Never park on zig zags or block school entrances
